Highlights include Firmament by Alexander Liberman, Pathway by John Safer, Faith Lift by Bret Price, a kinetic sculpture by George Rickey, Stone sculptures by Seth Velsey and Leo the Lion, moved from the old Steele High School.

Ebonia Gallery

Willis Bing Davis built his studio here in the Wright Dunbar neighborhood and in 2009 added a sculpture inspired by a Paul Laurence Dunbar poem, created of cutting-edge material at the National Composite Center in Kettering. Around the corner, down the alley is a mural reflecting the importance of literacy, commissioned by Wright Dunbar Inc, for the Credit Union Bldg.
